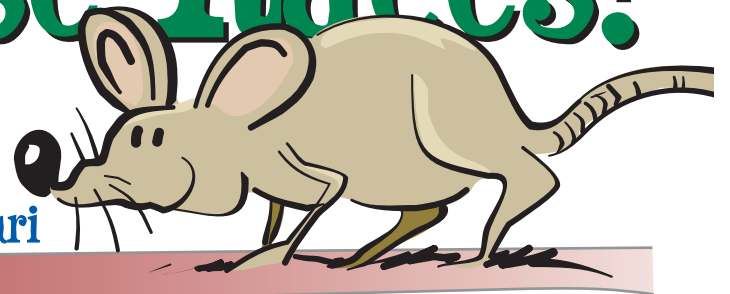

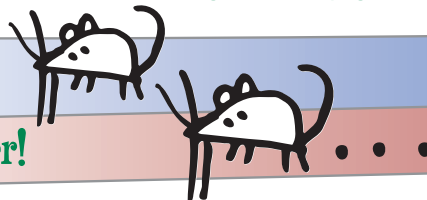

Fragile X Syndrome is the most common inherited cause of mental impairment. Approximately 1 in 3,600 males and 1 in 5,000 females in all ethnic groups are affected. An estimated 1 in less than 200 females and 1 in 800 males may be carriers. It is an abnormality of the X chromosome that causes disabilities ranging from varying degrees of learning problems to severe mental impairment.

Presently there is no cure for Fragile X Syndrome. Treatment is provided through special education, speech and language therapy, physical therapy and occupational therapy including sensory integration.

Fragile X Resource Center of Missouri provides support and information to individuals with Fragile X Syndrome and their families. The Center offers annual workshops for teachers,

therapists and parents. The Center also sponsors fundraisers that support research to understand Fragile X and find a cure, and that develop educational intervention methods to enhance the abilities of persons with Fragile X.
